RS BOARD MEETING MINUTES January 31, 2006

Board Meeting

The meeting of the N.C. State Board of Sanitarian Examiners was held on Tuesday, January 31, 2006 at 10:00 a.m. in Parker Lincoln Building, Raleigh. <u>Called to Order</u> – Malcolm Blalock, Chair called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m.

<u>Conflict of Interest Statement</u> – Malcolm Blalock asked Board Members if there were any conflicts of interest or potential conflicts of interest since the last meeting. There were no conflicts of interest stated.

Approval of the December 14, 2005 Minutes -

Board Action: <u>A motion was made and seconded to approve the October 20, 2005 Minutes with corrections.</u> All votes affirmative. Due to illness of the Secretary and the recorder malfunctioning, the December 14, 2005 minutes were not available at this time.

Approval of the Quarterly Financial Report –

Janice Jones presented the Quarterly Report for July 1–Sept 30 and another report on the current balances as of December 12, 2005.

Vice-Chair's Report – Terry Pierce

- Terry Pierce reported that rooms at the Parker Lincoln Building have been reserved for the Board's October meeting and exam.
- CIT training and Intern Approval were brought up for discussion. After much discussion, it was decided that when transcripts are received, the Secretary will forward them to Dr. Ogle for review. After receiving written provisional approval from Dr. Ogle, she will notify DEH that the applicant appears to be cleared for attendance at CIT.

Secretary/Treasurer's Report – Ann Gilstrap

 Ms. Gilstrap is still working on the revisions to the form letters. She will send a packet to all Board Members for comments and revisions.

Administrative Secretary's Report

Janice Jones reported that a new digital recorder had been purchased. She reported that renewals were steadily arriving and that verifying continuing education was taking a considerable amount of time. Numerous renewals were received without prior approval of their continuing education credits. Renewal cards were discussed. The 2006 cards will be printed all at one time.

Board Action: Mack Dendy made a motion that effective January 2007 a permanent card be issued to each RS and Intern one time only and will be issued to all new interns at the time of their approval. Motion was seconded by Nilla Sloop. All votes affirmative.

Ms. Jones reported that meeting rooms have been reserved at MAHEC in Asheville for the March Board Meeting and Exam.

In talking with Heidi Shaw at NEHA, Ms. Jones was informed that the new NEHA exam would be is use before our August exam date.

Motion made by Mack Dendy and seconded by Nilla Sloop to go into closed session. All votes affirmative.

Nilla Sloop recused herself for a portion of the closed session that dealt with discussion of the Wake County complaint.

Back in Open Session at 1:15 p.m.

Dr. Burton Ogle made a recommendation that no further action be taken in the Cherokee County Investigation. Recommendation was seconded and approved.

It was reported that in discussions with the RS involved in the Catawba County investigation, it appears that the individual may surrender his registration. The investigators agreed to contact the individual to determine if he plans to surrender his registration and request that he do so in writing.

In reference to the matter of a former Wake County EHS, a hearing to consider whether any action should be taken on her registration was scheduled for April 13, 2006 at 10:30 a.m. location to be announced later.

Legislative Committee Report – Ann Gilstrap

Ann Gilstrap discussed proposed changes to the Board's rules. After some suggestions from Board members, it was agreed that those suggestions would be incorporated and presented at the March Board meeting. The next step will be Board approval and then begin the formal rulemaking process.

Foreign Transcripts Evaluations – Dr Burton Ogle

Dr. Ogle reported that he had investigated through the US Department of Education how they look at this topic. His recommendation is that the Board requires any applicant with foreign transcripts to have the transcripts evaluated by the US Department of Education. The Education Committee was asked to develop a policy on foreign transcripts.

Environmental Health Study Committee - Layton Long

Layton Long reported that the Study Committee Report will be finalized for the March meeting of the Environmental Health Committee of the Health Directors Association. The report will not have any specific recommendations, but instead discusses the pros and cons of using environmental health technicians and privatization in the onsite wastewater program.
