- 1. Entire credential application signed and notarized (special application included); and
- 2. Provide proof of valid current (North Carolina) state registration; and
- 3. Sign NEHA code of ethics; and

Applicants must be sure to complete the entire application. This opportunity is only available to

environmental health professionals who can evidence that they are currently registered in North Carolina

and are in good standing under the state program. Therefore, please make sure to submit a copy of your

current state registration card, showing the expiration date of certification, along with your complete

application.

We should note that this is a special opportunity that is being extended to all state credentialed

environmental health professionals in North Carolina. The open window for this opportunity will close on

March 1, 2005. After that, in order to obtain the national credential, applicants will have to meet all of

NEHA's requirements independent of any consideration associated with state credentialed status.

NEHA looks forward to the opportunity to extend national recognition to you for your work and for your

achievements in the environmental health profession.

Thank you for your dedication to the environmental health profession. It is a matter of deep pride for us to

represent individuals like you whose commitment to environmental health strengthens the profession and

by virtue of your credential, elevates the respect given to all Registered Environmental Health
